## SHOPPING

The Scottsdale of today has developed into a renowned shopping destination for many visitors, featuring large shopping malls and many interesting boutiques, galleries and shops. The Scottsdale Fashion Square is the largest mall complex in the downtown area with 189 merchants, including Dillards, Neiman Marcus, Nordstrom, Robinsons/May, theaters, numerous specialty shops and restaurants. The old business district is now known as Old Town and Fifth Avenue Shops, where the flavor of the Old West is preserved in old buildings that date back 50 years or more. Here there is a concentration of art galleries, Native American crafts, unique shops and fine restaurants.

## RESORTS

Visitors to Scottsdale will find a wide selection of accommodations available in 36 hotels and resorts, 15 of which are located in the downtown area. The facilities, architecture and landscaping reflect the Southwestern way of life with emphasis on enjoyment of the out-of-doors. Nearly all have swimming pools, tennis courts, nearby golf courses, exercise rooms and more.

## ARTS & ENTERTAINMENT

Scottsdale has become world famous for its art and culture. The range of art to be found in the many downtown galleries is truly impressive: paintings, sculptures, ceramics, drawings, jewelry, textiles, pottery, baskets, wood carving, photography, antiques, etc. Quite naturally, the emphasis is on Western and Native American arts, but there are other galleries offering contemporary and traditional works from around the world. The Scottsdale Center for the Arts maintains a year-round schedule of concerts and performances as well as educational events. Downtown Scottsdale also offers many nightclubs and restaurants with a wide variety of live entertainment, dancing and comedy.

## OUTDOOR RECREATION

The climate makes Scottsdale a natural for outdoor recreation. Golf courses and tennis courts abound. There are 18 golf clubs and courses in Scottsdale, with the Continental and Villa Monterey golf courses located in the downtown area. Most courses are public; a few are private or are part of resorts. Tennis courts are everywhere - at most resorts, parks and high schools. Scottsdale Stadium, located just south of the Scottsdale Civic Center in the downtown area, is the baseball Spring Training ground for the San Francisco Giants and the site of many of their exhibition games.

## INDIAN BEND WASH GREENBELT

After years of planning, coordinating and construction, this multi-million-dollar project has become a Scottsdale showplace. With over seven miles of parks, golf courses, bike paths, softball diamonds, picnic areas, tennis courts and fishing lakes, the greenbelt serves the recreational needs of the community and its visitors while providing effective flood control.
